



# Thank you for making organ donation possible

30 years of saying thanks with Operation Popcorn

2021 marks the 30th year that BC Transplant and our volunteers thank the health professionals who make organ donation possible.

For 30 years, the delivery of festive packages of popcorn marks the kick-off to the holiday season in hospitals across BC. Starting as just a small campaign to a few hospitals when it launched, Operation Popcorn now annually involves 85 volunteers, and popcorn deliveries to 26 hospitals across the province.

Organ donation and transplant have also grown over the last 30 years. BC now supports almost triple the number of organ donors each year, with more lives saved through transplant than ever before. Today there are more than 5,600 British Columbians living with a transplant in our province.

This book is a reminder and thank you from some of the people who have been directly affected by organ donation. They are the transplant recipients whose lives have been saved, and the donors and donor families who said yes to organ donation. They all express only gratitude towards the caring professionals who have played a part in their journeys.

Many health-care professionals often only get to see the tragic side of organ donation. For 30 years, Operation Popcorn is our reminder of the people whose lives have been saved through organ donation and represent the lived impact of your hard work and dedication.

Thank you for your ongoing support and commitment to organ donation.








"This is my painting of a bear with a transplant ribbon in the heart. I'm strong and brave like a bear. I'm a transplant warrior!"






## Natalie Liver recipient (2017)








### Ted Lung recipient (2007)

My name is Ka Yee and I am a two-time kidney transplant recipient. I am truly thankful for the gifts of life and would like to express my heartfelt thanks to all of you for making this happen!

I was diagnosed with end stage renal disease and started dialysis when I was 14. Four years later, I received my first kidney transplant at BC Children's Hospital, which lasted for almost 16 years. In 2015, I went back on dialysis and received my second kidney in 2017 at Vancouver General Hospital.

Because of your dedication and hard work, and the kindness of my donors and the donor families, I am now in good health and am living a happy life. After my transplants, I have been able to enjoy outdoor activities such as hiking and kayaking. I have become a dialysis technician. #### Dear health-care staff,

My name is Kristy DelGrosso, and my mom Vicki was no stranger to the health-care system. In 1986 my mom was diagnosed with cystic fibrosis at the age of 32. I've watched my entire life as the best team of doctors and nurses tailored medications and treatment plans to give her the best possible quality of life. It is because of you that I got to hold her arm while I walked down the aisle to get married, because of you that I got to see my mom become a grandma and hold my daughter. It's because of you I got memories that I never dreamed I would get to have with my mom.

In 2017 my mom entered the ICU and was placed on an ECMO machine to await a double-lung transplant. For the next 16 days I clung to your every word. You filled me in every single day, and every single change over. You cheered for her and it felt like everyone there was on her side. Unfortunately we did not get the transplant we were hoping for, but thanks to your amazing care, some of my mom's organs were able to be donated. A simple thank you doesn't adequately express how I feel, but I've come to realize that no words ever will. You make a difference, and I will forever be grateful for all that you did for my family.

I am the proud parent of Elliott who was able to give the gift of life (pancreas, liver and kidney) when he passed suddenly after a motorcycle accident at 17. Elliott was moved to ICU and the staff was incredible, as hundreds of grieving friends and family descended on the hospital. You made a difference for so many. It has taken time, but almost 15 years later I am able to smile as I remember how happy he made me being a mum.
