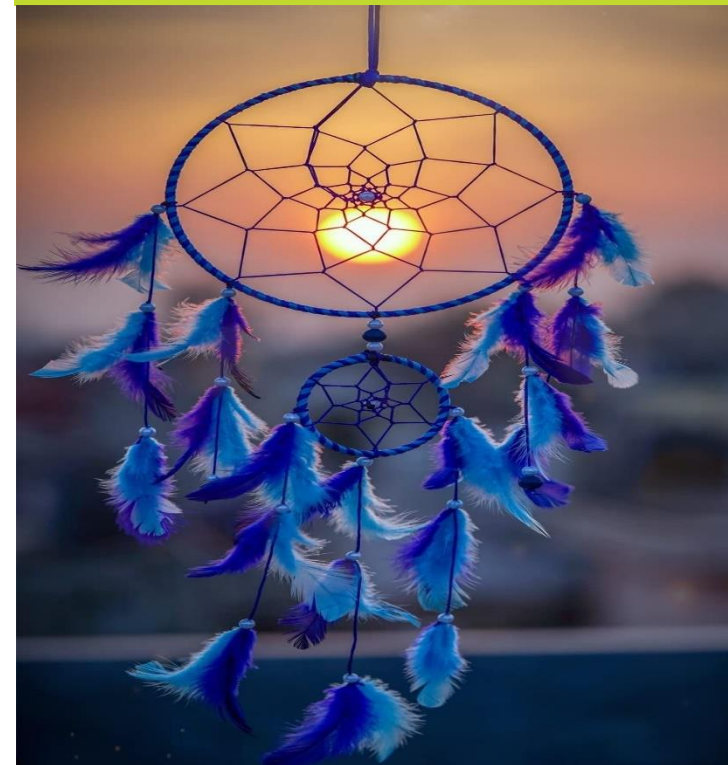

## Indigenous Care Coordinator

The Indigenous Care Coordinator is available to assist Indigenous patients by providing a range of health and mental health navigation, advocacy, discharge planning and support services while receiving care as a liver transplant patient.

The Indigenous Care Coordinator is a member of the interdisciplinary transplant care team and provides support to self-identified Indigenous patients and their families who have been referred for liver transplant.



## Services Provided

The Indigenous Care Coordinator helps you get the information and support you need. Services include:

- Liaising and advocating for patients and their families with their health care team
- Complete or assist with documentation for Indigenous specific funding for accommodations, transportation and / or meals through the FNHA, FN Bands, Tribal Offices, etc.
- Ensure the needs of the patients and families are represented while developing a plan of care
- Provide navigational support through pre- and post-transplant care
- Provide supportive counselling and case management services
- Provide support and access to spiritual and cultural supports

## Advocacy, Support and Assistance

Coming to the Liver Transplant Clinic and hospital can be stressful, especially when trying to manage complex health care needs or when you are travelling far from home.

### Indigenous Care Coordinator

The Indigenous Care Coordinator offers support to Indigenous patients and their families who are receiving liver transplant care. The Indigenous Care Coordinator works hard to ensure that Indigenous patients and their families have access to high quality, culturally safe care.

The Indigenous Care Coordinator helps to bridge the gaps between western and traditional medicine ensuring a holistic health approach.
